Farmer Family Statements (PIP)

CCCD & Turakura

The Farmer Family Statement or PIP statements reflect on the performances of farmer groups and their needs. This tool should be done with farmer (PIP) groups. The participants score 1 to 4 per question/ statement (1 = far from ideal situation, 2 = first steps, 3 = moving on, 4 = (nearly) ideal situation). The statements are:

Q1. I am able to generate sufficient income to cater for the basic needs of my family.
Q2. The production of annual crops and cash crops provide food for my farmer household family.
Q3. The number of livestock on my farm is....
Q4. Diversification on my farms has ...
Q5. I have all the relevant skills and knowledge needed to run my farm/ business.
Q6. In our household, our collaboration is ...
Q7. With regards to the decision-making at the household level, I feel ...

Q1. I am able to generate sufficient income to cater for the basic needs of my family.

Guiding principles/ questions

1. Sufficient income for basic needs generally means giving your family food, accommodation, health care services when needed, and children can attend school.
